



East Alabama Horseman's Association (EAHA) "Overall" Highpoint Awards

How to Qualify for Overall Highpoint Awards

- 1) Join at least one East Alabama Horseman's Association member club: Alexander City Horse Riding Club, Chambers County Saddle Club, Duke Ranch Riding Club, EAHA Youth Club, and/or Randolph County Horse Show Club. The shows and points do not count toward EAHA awards or State Show qualification until a member club is joined. (NOTE: Join all member clubs that you want to try for that club's year-end awards).

	 <p>etc. Sir Bucksalot, Shorty, Red, Hank, Cowboy, etc. (If your horse has a registered name and a barn name, pick one name and stick with it all season. If you ride Sir Bucksalot at one show and Bucky at another then, according to the show records turned into the pointskeeper, you have ridden two different horses.)</p>


- 2) Obtain a copy of the **2019 East Alabama Horseman's Association Rules** and the **2019 EAHA Overall Highpoint Categories** information and read them. These items are found on the website at: <http://achrc.com/eahashow.html>. If you have any questions, contact the EAHA President, Andy Housch.
- 3) In the **EAST ALABAMA HORSEMAN'S ASSOCIATION 2019 Overall High Point Categories**, find your category to see what classes count toward that category's awards.
- 4) Show the same horse in the same class(es) in at least eight (8) shows for the points from that class to count toward EAHA overall highpoint.

NOTE: There are 21 horse shows in the 2019 EAHA Show Schedule (<http://achrc.com/eahashow.html>).

- ALL 21 shows count toward EAHA Overall Highpoint awards. (The more shows you ride and the more classes in your category, the more chances for points.)
- Two (2) of those shows are EAHA shows – put those on your calendar and try to show in those shows as well; as the money raised at those two shows go toward year end awards and the more money, the better the awards.

How to Qualify for EAHA Overall Highpoint Awards – Cont’d
